RECOMMENDATION TO COUNCIL

Recommend the City Council adopt a resolution canvassing the votes cast at the November 6, 2018 General Municipal Election declaring Vice Mayor elect Krista Bernasconi and Councilmember elect Pauline Roccucci as the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes cast, and declaring Measure B , a half-cent (0.5%) Transactions and Use Tax to Protect Roseville's Essential Services passed by a majority of the votes cast during the election. Measure B does not limit the use of tax revenue and is therefore enacted as a general tax.

BACKGROUND

A General Municipal Election was held on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, in accordance with law, for the purpose of electing two councilmembers for a four year term of office and proposing the enactment of Measure B, a half-cent (0.5%) Transactions and Use Tax to Protect Roseville's Essential Services.

The Placer County Registrar of Voters office has determined the following two candidates received the highest number of votes cast and are elected to the office of the Roseville City Council:

Krista Bernasconi and Pauline Roccucci

The Placer County Registrar of Voters reports Measure B received a 62.44% approval rating and implementation of the tax will commence in April 0f 2019.

The swearing-in of both candidates elect and Mayor elect Bonnie Gore will occur on Monday, December 10, 2018 at 5:00 p.m. in the City Council Chambers located at 311 Vernon Street.

FISCAL IMPACT

Enactment of the half-cent (0.5%) Transactions and Use Tax established by the passage of Measure B is estimated to generate between \$16 to 18 million annually.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT / JOBS CREATED

Not applicable.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) does not apply to activities that will not result in a direct or reasonable foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment (CEQA Guidelines §15061(b)(3)). Canvass of the election results does not include the potential for a significant environmental effect, and therefore is not subject to CEQA.

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROSEVILLE CANVASSING VOTES OF THE NOVEMBER 6, 2018 GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION AND DECLARING THE RESULTS THEREOF PER PLACER COUNTY OFFICIAL ELECTION RESULTS

WHEREAS, a General Municipal Election was held on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, in accordance with law for the purpose of electing two councilmembers for a four year term of office and proposing the enactment of Measure B, a half-cent (0.5%) Transactions and Use Tax to Protect Roseville's Essential Services; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Roseville City Council to canvass the return of said election and to declare the results; and

1. That a General Municipal Election was held on Tuesday, November 6, 2018.
2. That the following candidates were voted on for City Councilmembers in said election:
Krista Bernasconi, Stephanie Dement, Bruce Houdesheldt, Sehrish Khan, David Larson, Pauline Roccucci
3. That the final tabulations of the votes cast is as follows:

Krista Bernasconi	25,127	27.99%
Pauline Roccucci	20,209	22.52%
David Larson	13,208	14.72%
Stephanie Dement	12,783	14.24%
Bruce Houdesheldt	12,282	13.68%
Sehrish Khan	5,878	6.55%
4. That the following two candidates received the highest number of votes cast for City Councilmember of the City of Roseville for a four year term of office:
Krista Bernasconi and Pauline Roccucci
5. That pursuant to Section 2.03 of the Charter, Krista Bernasconi is hereby declared to be the Vice-Mayor. The Vice-Mayor's term of office shall continue until the election, qualification and assumption of office of a successor following the next General Municipal Election, (2020). Upon termination of the term of office as Vice-Mayor, Krista Bernasconi shall be seated as Mayor. The Mayor's term of office shall commence upon the assumption of office and continue until the assumption of a successor following the next General Municipal Election.
6. That the term of office and administration of oath for Vice-Mayor elect Krista Bernasconi and Councilmember elect Pauline Roccucci shall commence at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, December 10, 2018.
7. That the following measure is hereby declared to have passed:

Measure B – Half-cent (0.5%) Transactions and Use Tax to Protect Roseville’s Essential Services

YES Votes	34,792	62.44%
NO Votes	20,928	37.56%

8. That the City Clerk is hereby directed to enter the adoption of this Resolution in the minutes of the City Council as a statement of the results of the General Municipal Election on November 6, 2018.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Roseville that the City Council ratify and approve the election results as presented.
