7. MATTERS TO BE HEARD

7.1. Fireworks Violation No.: 2024-34259

Appellant: Rebekah and Derek Anderson, 1214 Chesapeake Dr., Roseville

- Roseville Municipal Code Section 16.16.140 (F), Prohibited Fireworks – Host Liability

The representative for the City, Police Officer Devon Smith, was not present at the start of the hearing. The item was trailed to allow Officer Smith his 15 minutes from the commencement of the hearing to appear per the Administrative Hearing Procedures.

7.2. Fireworks Violation No.: 2024-34560

Appellant: Jefferson Ignatyuk, 4560 Loch Haven Way, Sacramento

- Roseville Municipal Code Section 16.16.140 (B), Prohibited Fireworks

A. Staff Report:

Police Officer Johnathan Yerzy offered testimony in regards to the staff report and citation entered into the minutes as Exhibit A (7.2) and answered panel questions.

E. Panel Discussion and Decision:

Regarding Roseville Municipal Code Section 16.16.140 (B), Prohibited Fireworks, the panel decided to deny the appeal and uphold the citation because the City proved by a preponderance of the evidence that the violation occurred and that the appellant is the responsible party.

Chairperson Arthur J. Pauly signed the decision form, entered into the minutes as Exhibit D (7.2), asked the Appellant to see staff for the paperwork, and informed the parties that they may file a petition for review with the Superior Court in Placer County within 20 days.

On July 5th, 2024, at approximately 8:47 p.m., Roseville Police Officer Jonathan Yerzy responded to a report of illegal fireworks at 114 N. Sunrise Avenue in Roseville. Upon arrival, Officer Yerzy contacted an individual (identified as Jefferson Ignatyuk), who had an expended mortar firework casing. Mr. Ignatyuk acknowledged that he discharged a prohibited firework. Mr. Ignatyuk was issued a Violation/Administrative Citation for one (1) count of violating Roseville Municipal Code Section 16.16.140(B). Officer Yerzy's contact with Mr. Ignatyuk was recorded on Officer Yerzy's bodyworn and will be shown at the conclusion of presentation of this staff report.

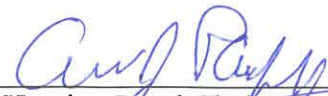

Narrative:

On July 20, 2024, at approximately 12:45 a.m., Officer Rosa Valdez was dispatched to a report of illegal fireworks at the intersection of Dawnridge Road and Cresthaven Drive. Officer Valdez contacted the reporting party who showed Officer Valdez a video depicting a 4-door white Cadillac stop near the above intersection, with three male subjects then exiting the vehicle and setting off several prohibited aerial fireworks. The three male subjects then got back into the vehicle and drove off. The reporting party also informed Officer Valdez that he had conducted an area check and located a matching vehicle in the driveway of 406 Shannon Drive. Officer Valdez made contact with individuals at 406 Shannon Drive, one being identified as Steve Skattebo. Mr. Skattebo acknowledged that he lit the prohibited fireworks that had been reported. Officer Valdez also located 2 more prohibited fireworks inside the vehicle. Mr. Skattebo was issued a Violation/Administrative Citation for four (4) counts of violating Roseville Municipal Code Section 16.16.140(B). Officer Valdez's contact with Mr. Skattebo was recorded on Officer Valdez's bodyworn and will be shown at the conclusion of presentation of this staff report.

Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, no person shall possess, manufacture, sell, use, display or explode any dangerous fireworks including, but not limited to, any rocket, firecracker, roman candle, squib, torpedo, wire core sparkler, wooden core sparkler, black cartridge, aerial shell or other combustible device or explosive substance or any kind of fireworks, by whatsoever name known, or any altered safe and sane fireworks within the city.

I want to dispute this and ask this charge to be removed from myself or a court date to be set. I appreciate your time in reviewing this.

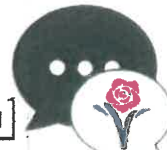
