2019 Commission Recommended Goals



City of Roseville Senior Commission
Submitted Goals for 2019 August Workshop

- Housing
- Transportation – try to lower the price of Dial-A-Ride for seniors
- Continue to develop methods to inform seniors and their adult children about the Senior resources that are available to them in Roseville. Partner with the Placer ADRC and OAAC to coordinate efforts. These organizations have been awarded a grant to develop marketing ideas that reach this audience. Also consider other knowledgeable partners such as the Placer Collaborative
- Include educational opportunities that inform seniors and their families of the importance of planning early before a crises, illnesses and death and not when they happen.
- Have a meeting at the least every other month
- Plan and reach an agreement on developing a presence on the Roseville website that informs the public about the Senior Commission with links to resources
- Have a commissioner responsible for tracking senior related legislative issues
- Develop a packet to be sent to the City Council with the last 5 yr accomplishments. Also include a rewritten version of the original letter addressing the National Crisis with Nursing Homes and include Senior Fraud and financial abuse. Include a question regarding what and where the Council would like to see the commission place our focus for Seniors Quality of life
- Start work on the issues identified in the WHO report that needed improvement by developing a plan to address them
- Develop a plan for goals to be identified as short term, long term or ongoing and appoint work groups accordingly
- Work with AARP to find partners in other communities that have addressed some of our concerns successfully

COMMUNICATIONS WITH SENIORS

- Determine what we want to communicate to seniors and develop a plan to address each item. For example information about transportation options, service programs available to seniors such as Cal Fresh etc..

- I would like to get involved with the county's effort to develop a 2-1-1 system to insure seniors are not left out. I know Bonnie Gore and would be comfortable talking with her about my involvement. This could provide us with another option to communicate with seniors.
- Review our current methods of communication to insure they are meeting our goals such as the city website, FAB etc., future use of RCONA and RPD's "Senior Outlook."
- The Senior Resource Meeting this week will tell us a lot about what seniors need, want and how we can improve communications
- Utilize AARP resources and experience

TRANSPORTATION OPTIONS FOR SENIORS

- Finish Commissioner Egan's plans. Commissioner Parry has some of his notes and did some preliminary work on the issue before Commissioner Egan took it over.
- Meet with West Sacramento's Associate Transportation Planner to learn about the "Via" program and other options they have for seniors.
- Commissioner Parry will be attending the SACOG meeting and hope to bring back some definitive ideas
- Update existing transportation programs such as "Mobility Training, Transit Ambassadors, etc. and communicate them to seniors, possibly through Meals On Wheels staff.

HOUSING ISSUES

- Identify existing programs to assist seniors with modifying their homes with grab bars, ramps etc.
- Explore using volunteers from local trade unions, junior colleges to assist seniors with these modifications
- Update the affordable housing programs implemented and planned for Roseville

HEALTH RELATED ISSUES

- Identify care giving services like in-home care, meals on wheels and other services. The resource meeting this week will help us identify programs and how we can partner with them or at least communicate their services to seniors.

1. Reducing isolation – loneliness and isolation lead to health risks such as heart disease and depression, and early mortality. It's equivalent to smoking 15 cigarettes a day.
2. Fall risk education to reduce number of falls. 1 in 3 seniors fall each year and 40% of those hospitalized don't return home after a fall. I have a 26 minute documentary I helped produce about this.
3. Brain health education, reducing the fear of Alzheimer's and dementia.
4. Nutrition, insuring that people are accessing benefits and services. "Food as medicine" theory/movement.
5. Changes in Medicare/Medical benefits to support in-home care and nonmedical care. PACE programs and what Kaiser is doing locally.
6. Family caregiver support; Respite.
7. Available housing options for fixed income seniors.



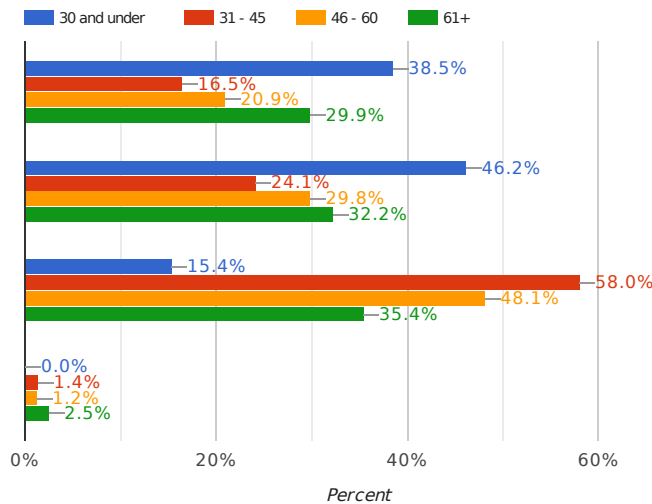

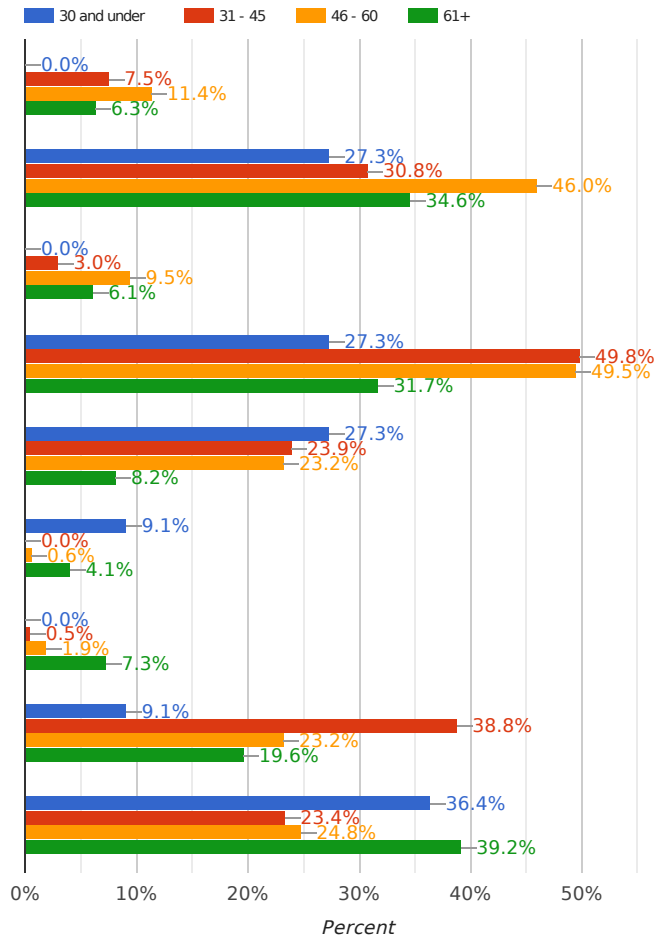

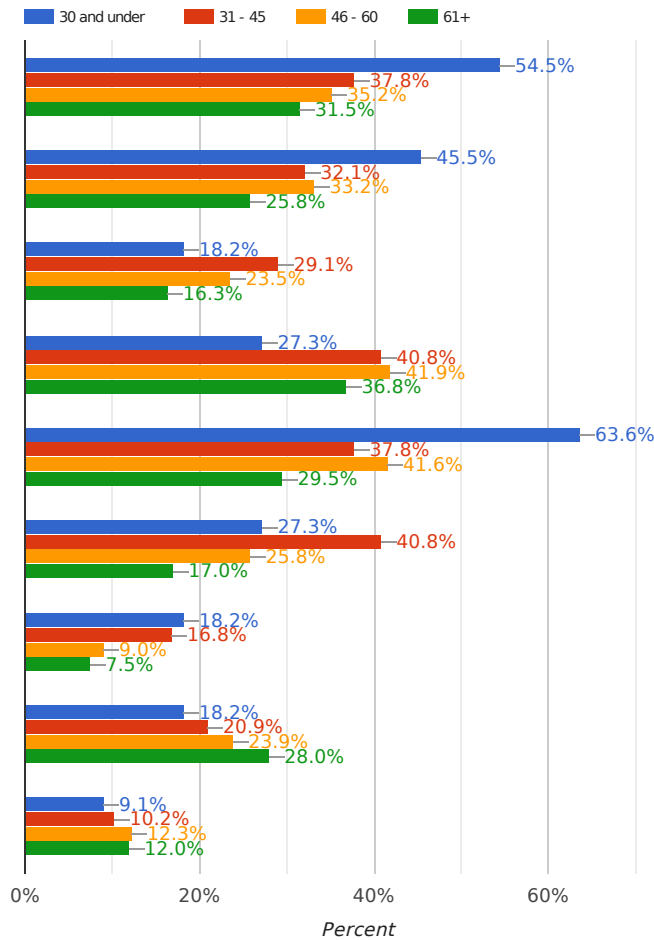

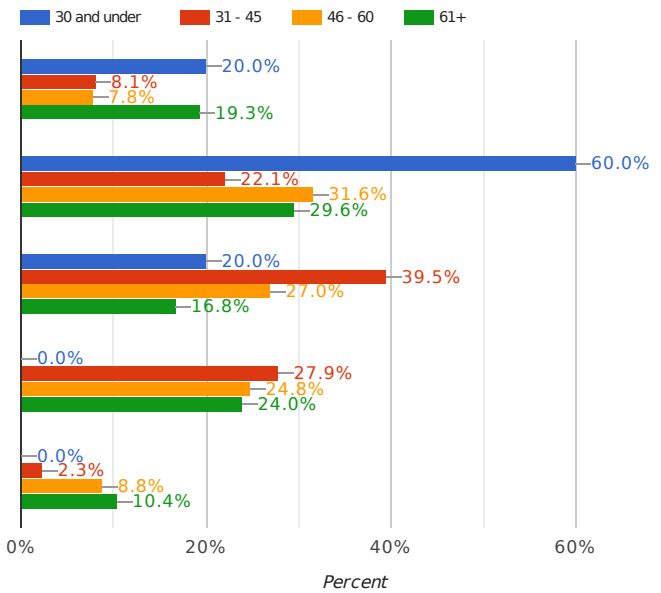

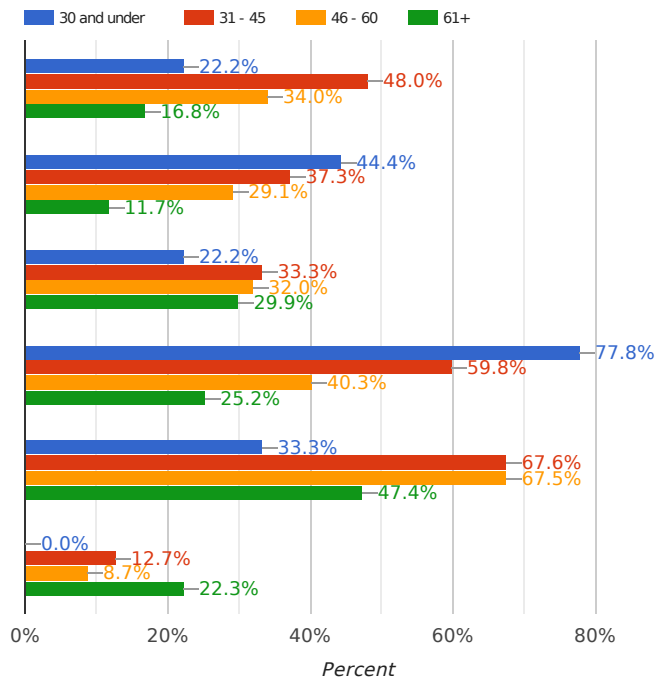

Barriers to volunteering are: (1) thinking only long-term commitments ("don't want to get stuck!") are available; can't; (2) intimidation of not knowing others; and (3) fear of looking stupid because you don't know what you're doing. Thus, I recommend a portal offering as many "digestible bites" as possible, that facilitates people finding their neighbors who are engaged, and even letting coordinators post videos. "I'm Shonda, and we're cleaning up (area) Saturday from 8 - 10 a.m. Park in the (biz) lot, and come to our table (which will be here) to check in and receive cleaning equipment. Then you will go here and here and put trash in bags, which you'll cart to plastic cans on the street. We'll have "yacht rock" playing for ambiance, and we'll have X scones and OJ for everybody who comes through." Annnnd scene. Also, you should create categories that award points for volunteerism - "most non-profits assisted," "most total hours," etc. Use app tech to create badges and rewards.

Corporate team building events for volunteering would be great. Easy to learn and train for 1 time activities.

I currently volunteer with Ca Dept of Fish and Wildlife, one to two days a week.

Put opportunities on Facebook and Instagram

Maybe a newsletter to aggregate volunteer opportunities from nonprofits within the city?

I know the way this sounds, but here it goes. It is more beneficial for me to work a few more hours a week and donate money to causes than my individual volunteer time would be worth. Having trained people for years the difference between someone who is doing something because they have a genuine drive to versus someone who (in best case scenario) does it occasionally is huge. The occasional person will take months if not years before they're competent where they are no longer dragging down the more experienced people. I would rather pay someone with a passion for a cause a full time job to effectuate change than volunteer as I feel that is more effective use of everyone's time and money.

**City of Roseville Senior Commission
Submitted Goals for 2022-23 August Workshop**

Commissioner Ambrozy

- I would like to see the City of Roseville get the information and assistance to seniors and their families in regards to health care directives, cognitive assessments, medicare and supplements. Implementation would include cooperation of local hospitals and urgent care centers.
- Finding a way for the public to access the senior commission for issues other than at meetings that are 4x/year
- Get the seniors in Roseville computer literate as this would increase communication and hopefully reduce isolation.

Commissioner Crawford

- Housing -more low income set housing for aging in place
- Increase usefulness of Dial-a- Ride
- Increase OLLI class availability in city spaces
- Plan quarterly program meetings for seniors in consultation with city and county agencies
- Develop a post Covid plan to deal with re-integrating seniors' participation in community events
- DO NOT HAVE TOO LARGE A TASK LIST!

Commissioner Garibaldi

- A simple magnetized small card to put on a seniors fridge. This would have a list of phone numbers for quick reference. 911, Senior Center, City Clerk, Fire, Police, Etc. (I know we have a Seniors First book but I'm trying to simplify immediate use.)
- Work with local realtors, to deliver to new homeowners, a list of Roseville services available to them. This is for any new homeowner not just seniors.
- Transportation for seniors that can't drive. Cost and availability.
- Housing for low/fixed income seniors.
- Weekly/biweekly lunch at the Maidu Senior center to provide a social gathering for seniors to meet. I'm sure we can get local restaurants to cater. Maybe charge a small fee for the lunch. (\$2)

- Help seniors learn to use smart phone or computer. Set up classes at different locations in Roseville or at senior residences

Commissioner Knapp

- Housing: Assist the city/Placer county on communicating their plan of action
- Transportation: Work with Seniors First by providing feedback to them for what is working in their new plan and what needs to be adjusted/included
- Communication: Continue to develop methods to inform seniors and their adult children about the Senior resources that are available to them in Roseville. Partner with the Placer ADRC (Aging and Disability Resource Connection) and OAAC (Older Adult Advisory Commission) to coordinate efforts. Include educational opportunities that inform seniors and their families of the importance of planning early before a crises, illnesses and death and not when they happen.
- Provide ideas/suggestions on developing an easier method to find links to senior resources on the Roseville website
- Have a commissioner representative on the OAAC (Older Adult Advisory Commission) and ADRC (Aging and Disability Resource Connection) to coordinate efforts/ideas on identified needs
- Coordinate work on the issues identified in the WHO report that needed improvement by developing a plan to address them in the goals identifying them as short term, long term or ongoing and appoint work groups accordingly
- Work with AARP to find partners in other communities that have addressed some of our concerns successfully

Commissioner Parry

- Improve communication with the senior community about available programs in the city and county. Possibly a Senior Services fair similar to what was done in the past.

Commissioner Rain

- Create awareness around healthy, positive aging - includes fall prevention, brain fitness and anti-ageism.
- Provide resources and hope to family caregivers - a sense of community so people don't feel alone.
- Spread dementia education by partnering with the initiative we heard about during last commission meeting.

Commissioner Zamora

- “Know Your Neighbor” opportunities for seniors to know each other and senior friendly neighbors
- Educational opportunities that inform seniors and their families of the importance of planning early before a crises, illnesses and death and not when they happen.
- Work with AARP to find partners in other communities that have addressed some of our concerns successfully.

PRL Strategic Master Plan Senior Commission Focus Group Outcomes

- Nice to have a park where grandparents can walk while kids play (e.g., Maidu, skate park).
- Dance classes for older adults (ballet, something that gives them exercise but not high intensity).
- Seniors may need transportation to get to our parks and programs.
- Be welcoming to new people. Some seniors have relocated and don't know anyone in Roseville yet. Have an ambassador who helps greet and include the new people.
- Might not drive from the west part of town to Maidu.
- Have a Senior Fair. Tell about programs (bunko, bocce, libraries, volunteer opportunities, police, fire, etc.).
- Sticker or magnet for refrigerator with city phone numbers (police, fire, PRL, dial-a-ride, healthcare, etc.).
- Meals on Wheels is important. Can we have senior meals served at Maidu?
- Good to put information at the Library. People go there. This came up from questions about if there is a bus service in Roseville.
- OLLI (Osher Lifelong Learning Institute) with Sierra College. Can we partner with them?
- Have a weekly lunch at Maidu.
- Second senior center location. Have senior programs at Riley Library.
- Wine tasting event at Maidu (also served desserts).
- Partner with healthcare for rehab programs at MSIP.
- Partner with Real Estate agents to provide information to prospective buyers.
