6.1. Welcome new Commissioner Malinda Meeks- Jeff Nereson

Jeff Nereson introduced Malinda Meeks, new Senior Commissioner. Meeks told the commission about her experience and history in the community.

6.2. Emergency Medical Services First Responder Fee Program-Fire
Captain Michael Bradley

Fire Captain Michael Bradley gave a slide presentation showing an overview of the extensive services and training that the City of Roseville provides. On October 7, 2020 the City Council adopted Section 9.27 of the Roseville Municipal Code – Emergency Medical Services First Responder Fee. This allows the City to collect fees related to the cost of providing emergency medical services that require transportation to the hospital by ambulance for both residents and nonresidents. This is a cost recovery mechanism for first responder paramedic services. Not all cities have firefighter who are also paramedics as Roseville does, giving an enhanced level of service. Emergency Medical Services First Responder fees have become an industry standard. Possible fee waivers and financial payment plan are available. Captain Michael Bradley answered questions from the Commission.

6.3 Safe Routes for Older Adults- Rebecca Espenshade & Alison Winter

Rebecca Espenshade and Alison Winter from the Transportation Department presented information to the Commission and asked for input about a future grant opportunity that would provide “Safe Routes for Seniors” similar to the existing “Safe Routes to School”. The grant would provide funds for infrastructure of bike and walking trails as well as programs such as walking and biking clubs, bike safety classes and updated interactive walking maps with estimated times. The implementation of this grant would be in 2026.

Laura Bell gave an update on current programming for older adults. FAB member ships are back. Currently 23 groups and activities are happening with more being added. The Maidu Library is offering free Drop-in Tech Help from 10-12pm on the first Friday of every month. The inaugural Age Well Roseville event was held on April 7, 2022 at the Roseville Sports Center and had over 300 in attendance, it included 40 informational vendors, 10 health and wellness workshops and was very well received and appreciated by all.
