6. REQUESTS/PRESENTATIONS

6.1. Crimson Ridge Park Improvements (Update) - Tara Gee

This is an information item only.

Update on improvements at Crimson Ridge Park.

Park Planning & Development Manager Tara Gee presented an update on improvements at the 2.3 acre Crimson Ridge Park, located in the Campus Oaks area.

The park opened to the public in April of 2023 and was constructed as a

developer build project. Budget constraints resulted in the reduction of planned park improvements and once opened, the residents approached the City seeking improvements that were more in line with the approved Master Plan. Since then, staff has met and communicated with the residents regularly and on October 17, 2023 staff presented a proposed plan of improvements and the next steps in the process.

The park is linear in design and runs between two residential roads. The proposed added amenities include new turf area, shade structure to existing picnic area, more pathways, enhanced landscape areas, and increased irrigation.

Next steps: City Council has approved the plans and specifications along with the budget adjustment. The plans are currently out to bid with hopes that construction can start in late Spring/early Summer.

6.2. Weber Park Renovations (Update) - Tara Gee

Update on Weber Park Renovations.

Park Planning & Development Manager Tara Gee presented an update on the rehabilitation project at Weber Park.

Staff has spent several years in public outreach which included surveys, in person meetings, virtual meetings, presence at events, and outreach collecting neighbor/resident feedback through the neighborhood association.

The approved master plan shows preserving the playground and swing area off of Circuit Drive, lowering the remainder of the park grade to be flush with the sidewalk off of Main Street for easy surveillance and overall public safety, a loop trail including fitness pods, expansion of the playground, reconstruction of the basketball court, and parking for police vehicles to allow a greater presence within the park. All improvements are designed to help with the overall safety of the park. To eliminate a location where problem behaviors occur, the restrooms will be removed as discussed at public meetings and at the recommendation of the Police Department. The absence of a restroom also makes Weber Park consistent with other neighborhood parks of the same size.

Next steps: The project was recently bid, and bids are being evaluated at this point. The park is a Council priority and construction should begin this Spring.
