6.2. Master Plan - Gibson Park Site - Tara Gee

Review master plan and recommend approval to City Council

Ms. Gee reviewed the master plan for the Gibson park site, a 13.75 acre city-wide park site. The highlights of the proposed plan consists of 12 pickle ball courts, 10 tennis courts, 3 full basketball courts, restrooms and picnic areas. Public outreach for the plan took place on two occasions: December 2019 and March 2020. Additionally open write in comments were solicited for community feedback. Comments received addressed parking, adding fitness equipment, adding a play structure and considering a dog park on the site.

Ms. Gee reviewed the calculations for determining parking spaces, addressed why the dog park and play structures were not included in the proposed master plan.

Public Comment was solicited while Commissioners discussed the park plan.

Commissioners had questions on exact location of the site, phases for

completion, the perimeter trail around the site and next steps for the plan.

No Public Comment received

Motion by Audrey Huisking, seconded by Roy Stearns, to approve the Gibson park site master plan and recommend to City Council for approval, pending environmental clearance. The Motion Passed.

Denis Nishihara served four years on the Commission which included representation on the Youth Sports Coalition, the Park Naming Committee and for several years as a judge for the 4th of July parade. Denis also took part in approvals for park masterplans, design review plans and recommendations to City Council.

Audrey Huisking served two terms and participated not only in numerous park design and masterplan reviews, but in several park dedications, 4th of July parades and events, Park Naming Committees, as well as serving previously on the Planning Commission. Kudos to Audrey for the extensive contributions to the City of Roseville.

Ms. Geller updated the Commission on the holiday events that the department was able to conduct abiding by current health restrictions.

RECOMMENDATION

Recommend the Parks and Recreation Commission appoint a Commissioner to the Youth Sports Coalition (YSC) which will become effective at the next YSC meeting.

BACKGROUND

The Youth Sports Coalition is comprised of ten members – three (3) Parks and Recreation Commissioners and seven (7) youth sports leagues. Each youth sports league member organization has one (1) representative to serve on the Coalition and may identify one (1) alternate representative.

The Parks and Recreation Commission shall appoint three (3) Commission members to serve on the Coalition. The Commission shall appoint one (1) of these three members to serve as the Coalition Chairperson and one (1) of these three members to serve as the Vice Chairperson.

In the event of the resignation or termination of an Appointed Representative or Designated Alternate, the Coalition or the Department shall request the appointing youth sports organization or Commission to fill such vacancy.

At this time, the Coalition currently has one vacancy that needs to be filled, with Commissioners Esparza and Bridge currently serving as the Coalition's Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact as a result of these changes.

SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION

Recommend that the Parks and Recreation Commission approve the Youth Sports Coalition's (YSC) recommendation to allocate resources from the YSC portion of funding to Roseville Youth Soccer Club for improvements to the soccer fields at Maidu Park. Roseville Youth Soccer Club may request to contribute up to \$72,840.

BACKGROUND

The Roseville Youth Sports Coalition (YSC) is a unique partnership between local independent youth sports providers and the City of Roseville. The youth sports partners provide athletic activities, opportunities and competition for participants, and the City provides game and practice fields for the partners.

The YSC is made up of seven youth sports providers within the City of Roseville. In 2021 the YSC pays a \$20 per participant fee to the City of Roseville to support youth sports within the City. Participant fees are collected by the City with \$15 dedicated to field maintenance and athletic field operations. The remaining \$5 is divided equally between YSC directed projects and City directed athletic projects.

Roseville Youth Soccer Club went through the proper project process. At the January 28, 2021 meeting of the YSC, the Coalition is scheduled to consider approval for spending authority to Roseville Youth Soccer Club in an amount of up to \$72,840 from the YSC portion of funding for this project. In anticipation of the YSC approval, a request for funding is recommended.

The project includes turf and irrigation improvements at the Maidu Park Soccer Fields.

FISCAL IMPACT

The payment of up to \$72,840 will come directly from the YSC Funds and will have no fiscal impact on the City portion of the YSC monies collected.

SUMMARY

Recommend that the Parks and Recreation Commission approve the Youth Sports Coalition's (YSC) recommendation to allocate resources from the YSC portion of funding of up to \$72,840 as requested by Roseville Youth Soccer Club for improvements to Maidu Park Soccer Fields.

SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION

Review the Johnson Pool renovations proposal and accept any public comments.

BACKGROUND

David Johnson Memorial Pool is one of the oldest recreation facilities in Roseville. The pool was built in 1921 and is located at the corner of Vernon and D Streets. This year, we celebrate its 100th anniversary year. The pool location serves two established neighborhoods including Roseville Heights and Cherry Glen. It is within walking distance of homes and is typically open eight weeks during the summer. Along with conducting swim lessons, free family swim nights are offered. This is also the location of our annual **Operation Swim** event. This program provides neighborhood children with towels, swimsuits and swimming lessons provided by community donations.

Proposition 68 Competitive Grant

Under Proposition 68, many grant programs have been established. Currently, the State-wide Park Development and Community Revitalization Program is offering grants on a competitive basis, in the amount of up to \$8 million per project. The average award during the last round of grants is \$4 million. Eligible projects are required to address the underserved in either parkland or income level. Based on a required half-mile radius, Johnson Pool serves an underserved community based on income. Staff feels that this project can be competitive in the pursuit of grant monies.

The grant requires at least five public outreach efforts starting no earlier than 2018. Staff conducted the following:

1. December 7, 2020: Meeting with the Cherry Glen Neighborhood Association
2. Starting December 14, 2020: Posted video recording of the virtual meeting on the city web site, inviting written comments
3. January 2021: Flyers sent out in both English and Spanish languages
4. January 23, 2021: On-site open house with staff and information available to residents
5. February 1, 2021: Parks & Recreation Commission meeting
6. February 24, 2021: Virtual neighborhood Association meeting

The following amenities will be completely renovated and/or relocated within the park site:

- Pool and deck
- Mechanical room and equipment
- ADA upgrades
- Locker room
- Staff room

The grant application is due in March 2021. Grant awardees will be notified by July 2021 and if awarded, the project must be completed by December 2024.

FISCAL IMPACT

The grant request will seek approximately \$3 million. No local match is required. Upon completion, of the project, park maintenance will continue to be allocated through the General Fund.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

Staff anticipates that the CEQA review will include a categorical exemption

SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION

Approve the following names for the noted new parks; and forward your recommendation to the City Council for formal approval.

- Four Corners Park for W-50C, a 1.2-acre neighborhood park located off Garland and Telluride/Silver Plume/Castle Rock in West Roseville.
- North Hayden Park for F-101, a 1.2-acre pocket park located off North Hayden Parkway in the Fiddymment Farm area of West Roseville.

BACKGROUND

Advertisement for names for the above parks occurred in July through August 2020. The advertisement period was four (4) weeks. The Park Naming Subcommittee, consisting of John Allard, Krista Bernasconi, Mike Esparza, Matthew Bridge, and Denis Nishihara, met virtually on September 30, 2020 to review the name submissions along with names on the "active" from last year. "Active" are those names received the year prior and not selected.

Pocket park F-94 was also eligible for naming. This is a 1-acre pocket park north of North Hayden in West Roseville (Fiddymment Farm). Given the timeline to begin construction of this park (Summer 2021), the Subcommittee has chosen to postpone naming this park until the next park naming cycle. Per the policy, the park naming advertisement occurs each July.

Consistent with policy, a short list of names will be forwarded for recommendation to the City Council, upon review and approval by the Parks & Recreation Commission. This year, the Subcommittee elected to forward only one name recommendation for each new park.

Names not selected for recommendation will remain on the "active" list for one year. Please see the attachments for the submission received during this latest advertisement.

FISCAL IMPACT

Park identification signs for new parks will be included in the construction budgets of each park.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

The California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) does not apply to activities that will not result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment, or is otherwise not considered a project as defined by CEQA Statute §21065 and CEQA State Guidelines §15060(c)(3) and §15378. The park naming meets the above criteria and is not subject to CEQA. No additional environmental review is required.

Salt water gets

tree death blame

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) — The salt water used for winter de-icing of highways has damaged or killed thousands of pine, fir and cedar trees in the Lake Tahoe Basin, according to the U.S. Forest Service.

Rangers said Wednesday the adverse effects of the salt have been noted at 306 sites.

Trees growing near de-iced highways were more often damaged or dead than trees at great distances from the pavement, they said. In some cases, trees up to 100 feet from the highway showed damage.

California Regional Forester Doug R. Letz said the damage would continue if the use of de-icing salt continued at the present level.

Letz said the salt is taken up into the trees through the roots as the snow melts in the spring and accumulates in the tips of the needles.

As salt concentrations increase, he said, the needles brown and die, the trees weaken and — when needles are killed — the tree dies, the forester said.

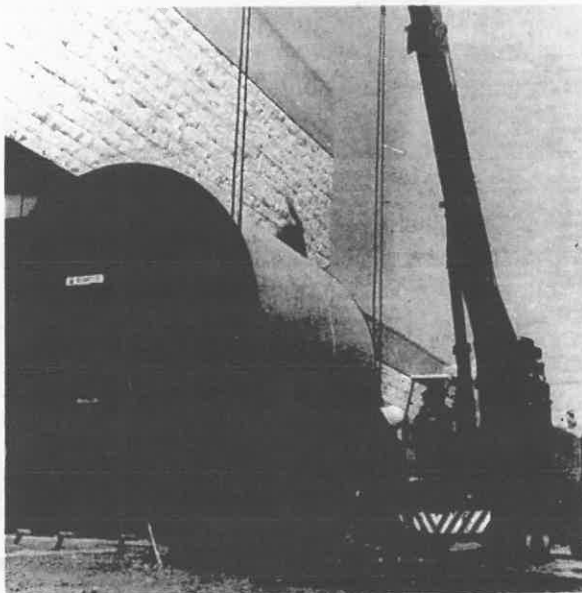

Assessment area talks for council

City councilmen tomorrow will conduct a public hearing at 8 p.m. in city hall on formation of an Atlantic Street East Assessment District for reconstruction of existing streets within the district to city standards.

Improvement costs will be partially financed by a \$93,000 federal Community Development Block Grant received last December from the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The remainder of the cost is to be apportioned among the property owners according to property frontage, as provided by the Municipal Improvement Act of 1915.

The estimated assessment cost is about \$47,000.

The proposed assessment district lies southeasterly of Atlantic Street and predominantly encompasses the Elmwood Subdivision.

Improvements to be made consist of regrading the existing streets to a uniform profile with the new structural section and providing adequate drainage collection and disposal by constructing curbs, gutter and drain inlets.

Center, Shafter, East and Parry Streets are proposed to be constructed to 37 feet in width, with three foot rolled curbs and gutters. Elmwood Avenue is proposed to be constructed to 26 feet in width, with three foot rolled curbs and gutters.

Purpose of the hearing will be to receive comments on the public con-

city way at the present location of Madard Lane.

The council also will take action on a resolution formally amending the city's general plan for the Bill Struich property at the west end of South Harding Boulevard.

Approval of the general plan amendment, from medium low density residential to commercial use, was unanimously approved by the council at its March 17 meeting.

Development and use of the property will be taken up during future rezoning hearings.

Other items set for council consideration include:

A request from Electric Utility Director Willis McMinden for an electric rate study due to the increasing cost of materials, labor and purchase of power from the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation.

A request from City Librarian Helen G. O'Connor to have the city enter into an agreement with the Auburn Placer County Library to buy catalog cards for the city at 30 cents per set.

Approval of an agreement for professional services with David M. Nicksar, special counsel for the Hospital Commission. The Roseville Community Hospital board of directors approved the investigation reimbursement agreement March 23.

Setting of public hearings for April 21 on an appeal from Rogene Sue and Charles W. Hens to the Planning Commission to change from residential use to commercial use.

Social Security gets boost from attorney

Social Security remains the best bet for retirement according to Merton Bernstein, law professor at Washington University in St. Louis.

"No Social Security will not run out of money in 1985. No, it will not collapse early in the next century. We are in a situation where panic pervades the press. Fear stalks TV," he declared.

He pointed out Social Security, along with other federal government retirements, is by far the best deal available to all Americans.

Bernstein questioned why criticism, investigation and demand for reform cries are directed at Social Security rather than at state, local and private pension plans.

In his enthusiasm for Social Security, Bernstein listed lots of reasons why it is

the best bet, then said "Best of all, Social Security benefits are fully indexed to the cost of living as determined by the Consumer Price Index."

"No, inflation does not erode their value."

"Indexing, inflation proofing, is unknown in private plans so, despite the fact that retiree benefits sometimes are improved, private plan benefits generally decline in value as retirement wears on."

"Some state and local government pension plans index to some degree, but often they index survivor benefits to a lesser degree and many do not index at all."

He also calls the famed Krough and independent retirement account plans "dubious investments despite the tax deductibility of contributions."

"With modest earnings, on the average of 7.5 percent double-digit inflation soon cancels the tax benefits."

Criticizing state and local government plans, he listed what he called "two additional hazards."

Many are contributory, he said, and that means that

seriously under-funded. A General Accounting Office study sounds the alarm that under-funding threatens the ability of many such plans to make good on their pension promises.

Regarding the Social Security "crisis," Bernstein insisted "while it is prudent to be concerned, the cry of crisis seems unwarranted."

He noted Congress has already acted by diverting a small amount from the Disability Insurance Trust Fund. This fund is in surplus and even it was said to be near bankruptcy a few years ago.

The best prospect for change, Bernstein said, is a plan offered by U.S. Rep. Barber Conable, R-N.Y., to fund half of Medicare hospital insurance from general revenue.

He noted immigration is increasing, likely from 400,000 to 800,000 potential workers annually, and that this would reduce a possible Social Security deficit by at least one-third.

"These benefits are not wage-related," he said, "and the program is so full of social purpose. The resulting amount of Social Security

Park Naming Process

Parks, Recreation & Libraries

On January 18, 2017, City Council approved changes to the park naming process. These changes apply to parks and facilities within parks only. The naming process for City buildings and other City facilities remains unchanged.

Annual Advertisement Period

On the first working day in July, a press release would be sent out notifying the public and interested individuals that name suggestions are being sought for new parks and new facilities within parks under construction during that fiscal year period (July 1 to June 30). This suggestion period is open for three weeks. Names should be submitted to the City Clerk and forwarded to appropriate staff.

Annual List

The names received during this open advertisement period would be compiled into a list with the following provisions:

1. The list will be maintained as "active" for a one (1) year period and will be reviewed for name considerations for park projects and facilities within parks scheduled for construction during the same time period of the advertisement;
2. The Park Naming Subcommittee maintains the right to select a name appropriate for the park based on geographical location, such as street names, subdivision name, or adjacent school name;
3. A name suggestion cannot be submitted more than three consecutive years;
4. The Park Naming Subcommittee maintains the right to select a name not on the "active" list due to special circumstances, such as historical significance; the passing of an active contributor(s) to the community; or other.

Criteria for Naming a Park Facility

Names must:

1. reflect geographical location;
2. reflect significant natural features;
3. honor a significant individual (See below)

Individuals must have made a significant contribution to the Roseville community, including, but not limited to:

- A - Donation of land or large financial contribution to a specific facility;
- B - Contributed substantially and improved the quality of life in Roseville. This could relate to involvement with Parks and Recreation or other volunteer community involvement activities towards the betterment of life in Roseville.
- C - Died or disabled in the line of duty as part of City service.

Naming of new parks or recreation facilities should also consider:

- Including "Roseville" for regional or city-wide parks and recreation facilities;
- Avoidance of duplication of surnames in order to ease confusion of sites and locations for the general public;

The Subcommittee reserves the right to consider exceptions due to extraordinary circumstances which inspire vision and civic engagement. Exceptions can be made when the actions or contributions of an individual not normally meeting the established criteria are so significant and profound that this person deserves consideration.

Each park or facility within a park, such as ball-playing fields, groves of trees, walkways, trails and buildings, or special rooms in a building could be named after selected individuals in their honor as desired and as appropriate.

It is noted that the City of Roseville is grateful for the sacrifices of our fallen soldiers and veterans who served our country. With limited parks and recreation facilities available, it is difficult to place a higher value or honor of one life over another. Therefore, honoring our fallen soldiers and veterans shall be directed to existing veteran-related programs within the City.

Additionally, re-naming of an existing park due to costs, potential loss of neighborhood identity and other considerations shall be discouraged. The City Council reserves the right to consider park sites, not associated with a specific individual(s), to add onto an existing established park name due to special circumstances. In such cases, the original park name shall not be replaced. Under these special circumstances, community contributions towards the offset of costs incurred to change signage shall be a component of the approval process. To ensure geographically named parks remain a part of the process, an effort shall be made to balance the naming of parks in the range of 20% of the parks within the park system inventory shall be geographically based at any given time.

Selection Process

The Park Naming subcommittee is made up of the three officers of the Parks and Recreation Commission; the Mayor and one City Council member.

1. The Subcommittee shall review all names and recommend a short list of up to three name for each new park or recreation facility scheduled for construction during the same fiscal year;
2. he short list of selected names shall be reviewed by the Parks and Recreation Commission for consideration at a formal meeting;
3. Thereafter, the Parks and Recreation Commission shall forward the short list of recommendations to the City Council for formal approval. The Commission may elect to recommend a name per park or facility for Council consideration along with the short list; All I names submitted during the submission period shall be forwarded to the City Council with the recommendations. This shall include the "active list" of names from the previous year;
4. Potential namesakes will be contacted by Staff prior to the Parks & Recreation Commission meeting
