6. REQUESTS/PRESENTATIONS

6.1. Recreation Programming- Kelsey Myers, Hayley Harlan, Megan Eaton Overview of Youth Programming.

Recreation Coordinator Hayley Harlan reviewed the recreational offerings such as themed camps, cooking classes, STEAM programs, and performing arts programs. Kelsey Myers provided insight on the Summer Day Camps successful registration and other information about PRL summer camps. Megan Eaton reviewed the Leadership Development Program for teenagers which provides volunteer and job opportunities in the field of Parks, Recreation & Libraries. Megan also provided updates on program efficiencies, partnerships with Placer County Office of Education, and adding multi-generational class offerings.

Public Comment: Ms. Meeks-Harris inquired about staffing challenges. Staff informed that we would like to see an increase in the number of applicants received and that applicants may live outside of Roseville city limits.

6.2. Recreation Facilities- Jon McElroy, Jake Hassell, Will Neville Overview of PRL recreation facilities.

Recreation Coordinator Jake Hassell provided an overview of the Mahany Fitness Center which offers fitness classes, memberships, camps, events, and rental opportunities. Recreation Coordinator Jon McElroy discussed the Maidu Community Center as being primarily a facility rental site for large events such as the Holiday Craft Fair, Placer PROTECT's senior resource fair and is the home of Roseville's Fifty and Better Program (FAB). Both facilities offer exceptional experiences and benefits to customers and thus have seen an increase in customer usage and revenue. Improvements to the facilities include renovations to room rentals, new exercise equipment, new program offerings, and new audio and visual systems.

6.3. Parks, Recreation & Libraries Budget- Jill Geller

Overview of the proposed Parks, Recreation & Libraries FY 2023-2024 Budget.

Parks, Recreation & Libraries Director Jill Geller presented an overview of the PRL budget for Fiscal Year 2023-2024. The responsible fiscal budget allows the department to continue providing valuable Parks, Recreation & Library services and improve the quality of life in Roseville.

Public Comment: Ms. Thompson would like more marketing on the new dog park to encourage residents to utilize designated spaces for dogs.

Jill Geller provided the commissioners with copies of the City of Roseville Strategic Plan and the FY2023-2024 Budget in Brief pamphlet, and reminded the Commissioners of the Roseville Soccer Complex Groundbreaking on Thursday June 8, 2023.
