Consent Calendar - If applicable, the Consent Calendar consists of routine items that may be approved by one motion. Any person can remove an item from the Consent Calendar to be discussed separately.

Agenda Items - Speakers have five minutes to address items that are listed on the agenda.

Levine Act Provisions - The Levine Act requires a Party (or its agent (s)) to a Proceeding before the City of Roseville that involves any action or consideration to their contract, license, permit, or other entitlement for use, to disclose any campaign contribution made to City elected or appointed officers (including Councilmembers, Planning Commissioners, and members of other City boards and commissions) totaling more than \$250 within the 12 months before the City decision.

Americans with Disabilities Act - Notify the City Clerk or Secretary at least 72 hours in advance if special assistance is required to participate in a meeting including the need of auxiliary aids or services.

Audio/Visual Presentations - If making a presentation regarding an agenda item, audio/visual materials must be submitted to the City Clerk or Secretary at least 72 hours in advance.

What Does Reliability Mean?

The ability of an electric power system to withstand various conditions while delivering safe and consistent electric service to customers.

Electric Key Performance Indicators

Industry standard metrics used to evaluate reliability:

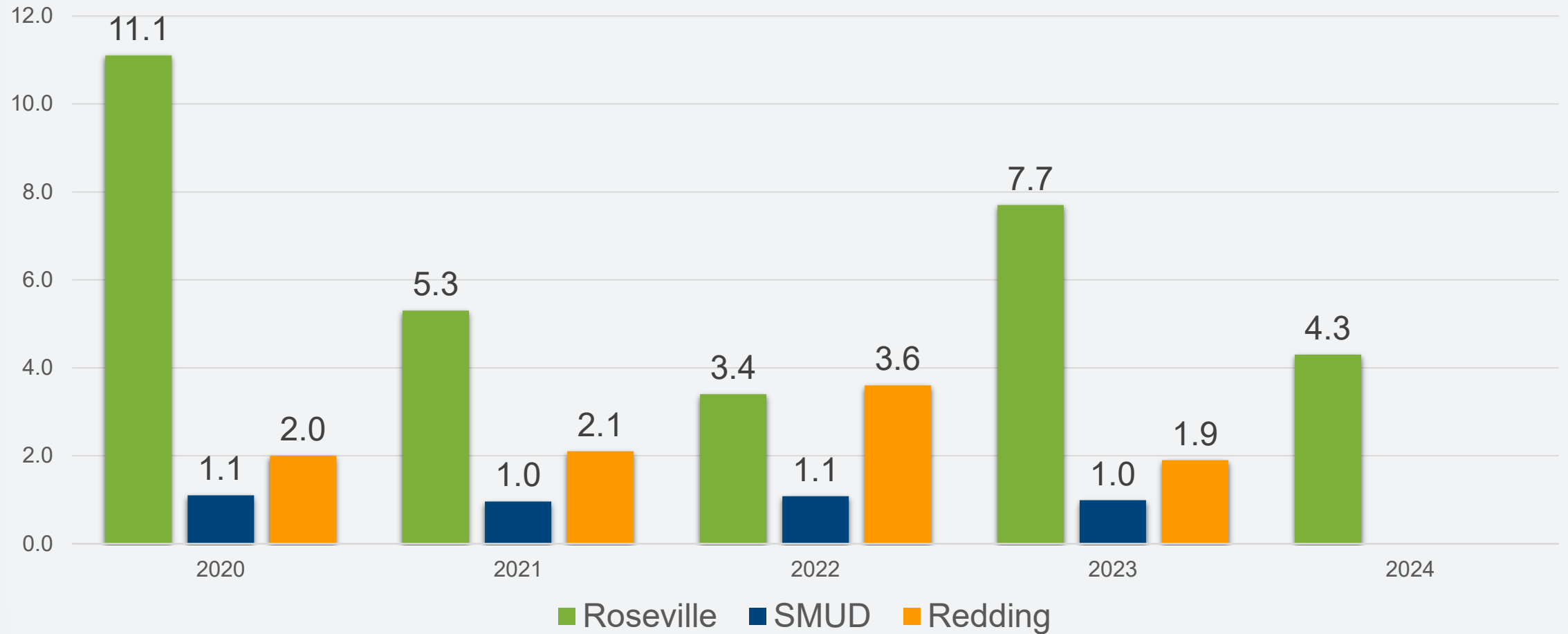
Outage frequency:

How often a customer experiences a power outage.

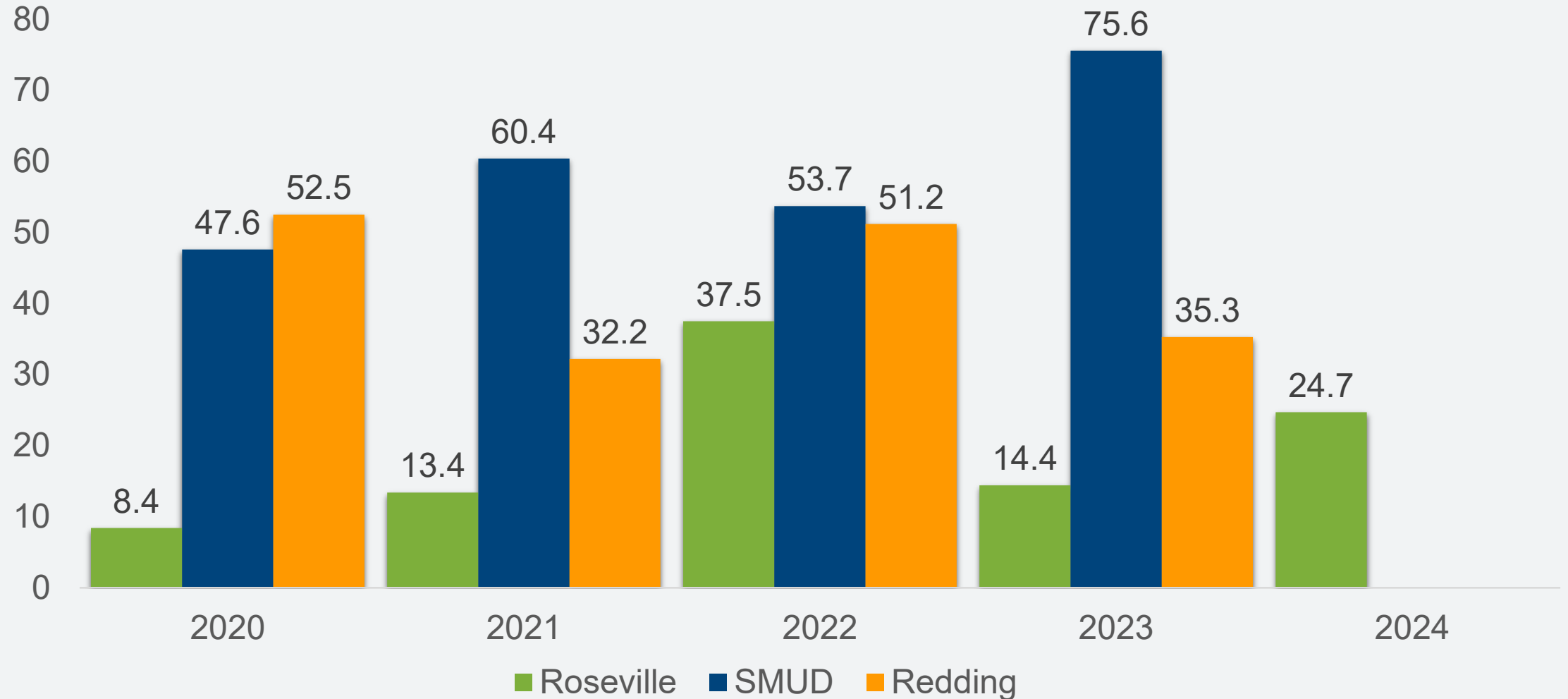
Outage length:

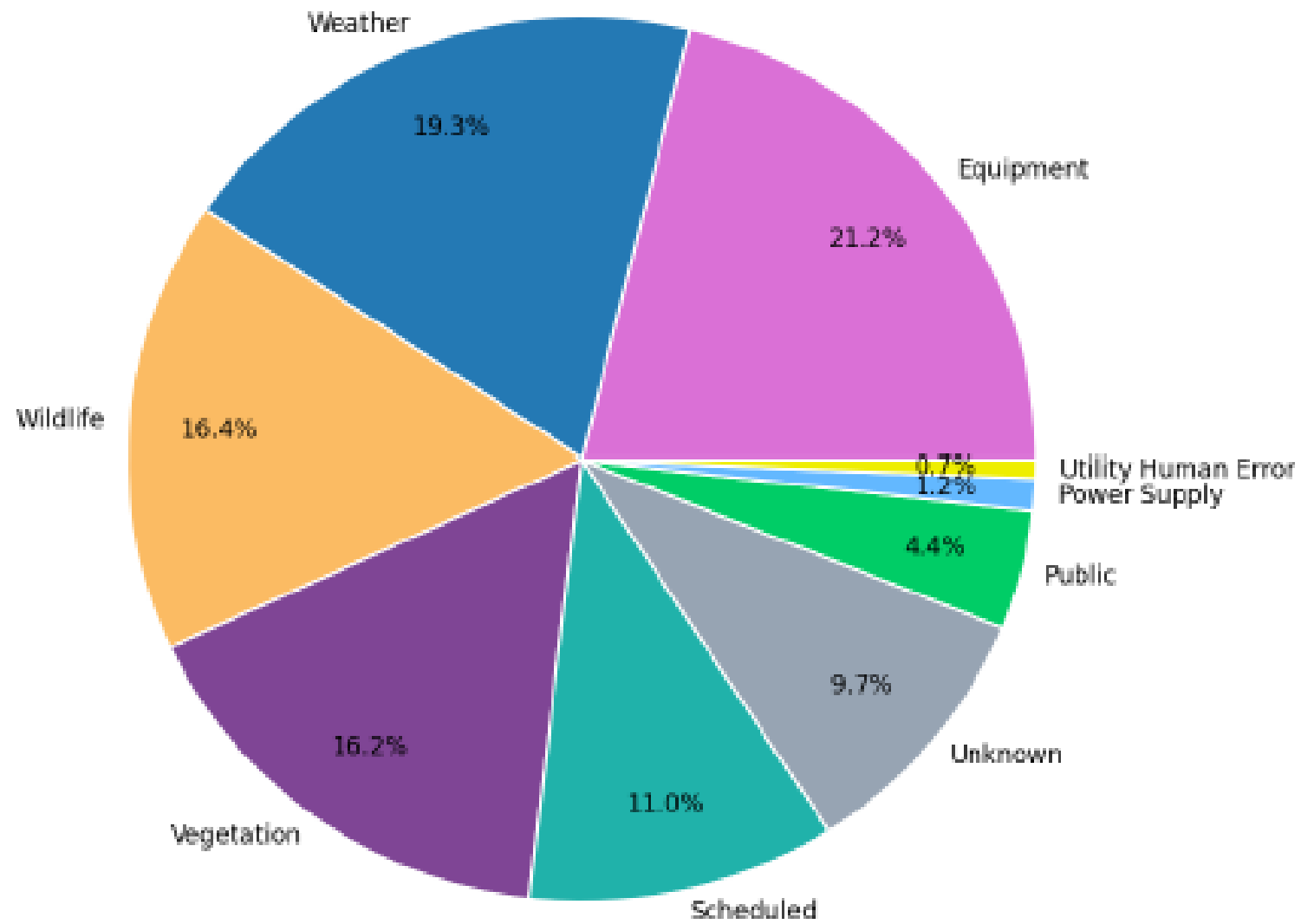
The average outage duration for each customer served.

2024 – Other Outages

Outage Mitigation

- Routine substation maintenance & inspection
- Proactive aged cable and equipment replacement
 - \$9.5M proposed funding in next 5 years
- Routine field equipment inspections
 - Poles
 - Connectors
 - Transformers
 - Pad-mounted Switches
- Tree trimming
- Summer Preparedness Plan

Reliable System Design

- System is 86% underground
- All new installations designed with underground lines and pad-mounted devices
 - Minimal risk of failure due to weather
- Designed for additional growth and flexibility
- Customers can be fed from multiple sources
 - Power can be maintained while work is performed
- High voltage system is *networked* (redundant)



Fast Response

- Our First Responders are:
 - Highly qualified and trained field crews
 - Dispatched immediately after a problem is detected
 - Average response time for 2024 = 37 minutes
