1. Western System Power Pool Agreement Collateral Annex (ELECTRIC DEPARTMENT - FINANCIAL & ADMINISTRATIVE)

Summary: Staff recommends approval of the Western Systems Power Pool (WSPP) Collateral Annex, including the Cover Sheet Elections, with Altop Energy Trading LLC ("Altop"). These documents supplement the WSPP Agreement previously executed by the City and establish

industry-standard credit and collateral provisions that would apply to any future wholesale physical power transactions with Altop under the WSPP framework. There is no cost associated with the execution of these documents.

Summary: Staff recommends approval of a reimbursement agreement with Roseville City School District for architectural and civil design services, DSA (Division of State Architect) permitting and construction administration services, plumbing and electrical services, and DSA inspection services to connect and install a City of Roseville purchased modular building to operate a new Adventure Club at Winding Creek Elementary School opening in fall of 2026. The reimbursement agreement should not exceed \$234,508, including contingencies, and is funded by a General Fund subsidy to the Youth Development Fund.

Summary: Staff recommends approval of an agreement with the Woodcreek SeaWolves for the purpose of joint use of the Roseville Aquatics Complex. The Woodcreek SeaWolves will pay the City an annual rental fee over the term of this agreement in addition to fees for their use in excess of the agreement. The total General Fund revenues from the agreement are expected to be \$57,802.

The cost of the agreement is \$532,000. An authorized change order authority of up to 20% (\$106,400) as a construction contingency, would bring the total contract amount to \$638,400. The Permit Center Remodel Project is budgeted in the General Fund.

Grant Building and Envelope Project for the design contract and staff time.
