Agenda Items: Speakers have five (5) minutes to address items that are listed on the agenda.



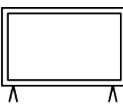

1. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Scott called the May 19, 2025 Library Board Meeting to order at 6:00p.m.

5. Presentations/Reports

5.1. Approval of March 24, 2025, Minutes.

Motion made by Fisk to approve the March 24, 2025 Library Board Meeting minutes. Seconded by Fullmer. All in favor, none opposed. Motion passed.

5.2. Library Fines & Fees

City Librarian Narinder Sufi provided an overview of the Library's current fees and fines policies and procedures. If library items are not returned or renewed by the due date, overdue fines of .25 per item, per day are charged. In addition, lost and damaged items are charged full cost. Accounts owing over \$50 for more

than 30 days are referred to a collection agency. The library also charges .20 per black and white page and .50 per color page printed at the public copy machines. The purpose of overdue fines is to encourage the timely return of library materials. Fines and fees currently account for 14% of the library's materials budget. Opportunities for multiple renewals and reminder notifications are available to avoid fines. The library continues to evaluate its fines and fees policies.

Chair Scott opened this for Public Comment.

Emerald "Esme" Snow Reyna asked for the board's support in eliminating library late fines in Roseville. Ideally for all materials, but at the very least for children's books. She appreciated that the Roseville's current library policies are very reasonable, but that having overdue fines-especially on books for children- are a punitive source of funding that creates stress for families and makes the library feel less welcoming. She cited a 2019 study by the Urban Libraries Council showing that fines do not increase the timely return of materials and eliminating them leads to higher return rates and library use. Also cited was an American Library Association study in 2019 that showed that library fines disproportionately affect lower-income households and can deter families from using services meant to be free and open to all.

5.3 Library Summer Reading Program 2025

Library supervisor Cambria Evans and Librarian Nathan Garcia provided an overview of the library's upcoming 2025 Summer Reading Program. Summer reading helps children keep their skills up, fighting the "summer slide". It encourages a lifelong habit of reading and interest in the library and its resources. It provides an opportunity for fun family time and draws reluctant readers in with activities. The 2025 Summer Reading Challenge dates are June 2 – August 2 and the theme continues to be Read.Imagine.Explore with the sub-theme "Level up @ Your Library!" Sixteen programs and events are planned. Brag tags will be awarded for reading and the library will offer 52 different styles this year.

5.4 Library Programs: Storytime

Librarian Katrina Brady provided an overview of the library's all-time favorite Storytime program and shared plans to enhance this program in fiscal year 2025-2026. Storytime is more than just reading a book. It promotes literacy and safe spaces, supports school readiness and empowers care-givers. Storytimes are built around the 6 early literacy components of print awareness, print motivation, letter knowledge, phonological awareness, vocabulary and narrative skills. Participants also practice listening and following directions and building focus. A variety of storytimes are offered. Read Aloud Program offers a quiet atmosphere. Baby Lapsit Storytime is for the youngest ages. Regular storytime is a high energy and interactive program. American Sign Language Storytime is offered at the Downtown Library and is led by Placer County Office of Education teachers alongside library staff. Fountains Outreach Storytime and StoryWalk at

Maidu Regional Park are also offered. The library will offer 620 total storytimes this fiscal year with more than 32,000 attendees so far.

5.5 Libraries & Culture Report

City Librarian Narinder Sufi provided an update on the Libraries & Culture Division operations, including libraries, Maidu Museum & Historic Site, and cultural arts efforts. The State Library has decided to pause programs that relied on federal funds due to uncertainty surrounding payments from that source. The Roseville Public Library currently has its New York Times subscription funding through a federal grant and is currently looking for alternate funding. No further cuts to funding are expected from the state. The library is enjoying successful programs and in addition to the Summer Reading Challenge, the Spring Reading Challenge is offered. The library will be offering extended open hours from June through the end of August and will be bringing six seasonal staff on board to help. Long-time Librarian Sara Schlehofer will be retiring at the end of June. A new mural has been added to Weber Park called "I am Hopscotch".
