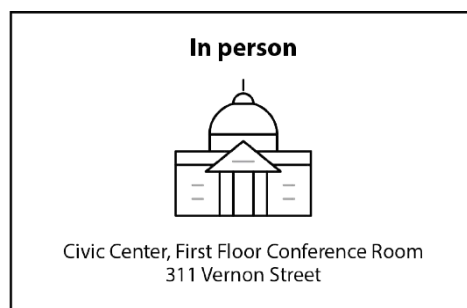

1. CALL TO ORDER

The Recording Secretary, Teri Payne, called the August 13, 2025 meeting of the Senior Commission to order at 2:00 pm.

2. ROLL CALL

Present: Janisch, Rao, Lee, Wagner, Starrh, Soto
Absent: Cheng - Excused

3. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner Janisch lead the Senior Commission in the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Roseville resident Jennifer (no last name given) from a senior community in Roseville off of Sunrise Blvd., commented about the difficulties of roadway access into the community. She is advocating that the speed limit for this area of Sunrise near the senior community should be 25 mph, per a California Vehicle code. Jennifer has also commented at City Council Meetings on the same topic.

Jennifer also encourages the commission to look further into the new Placer Rides program for possible modifications so that volunteer drivers would be managed by the program staff rather than putting that burden onto seniors.

5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

5.1. Meeting Minutes- May 14, 2025

6. REQUESTS/PRESENTATIONS

6.1. Accreditation and Gold Medal Presentation – Jeff Nereson

Parks, Recreation and Libraries Manager, Jeff Nereson shared a project that has been a goal of the department for some time, called CAPRA Accreditation.

CAPRA is the commission for accreditation of parks/recreation agencies. There are 10,000 parks/recreation agencies in the nation. Only 214 of those agencies are accredited, with only 5 in California.

Jeff shared details of what was involved in the process to become accredited and why it is important, including ensuring that PRL meets national standards and improves operations.

In April of this year, CAPRA review team members visited facilities, met with staff, and continued to review and ask questions about our submission. At the end of their visit, they announced to staff that we had passed 100% of the standards and will receive accreditation at the upcoming NRPA Conference in September in Orlando, FL.

Jeff then spoke to the commission about the National Gold Medal Award, which honors public park and recreation agencies and state park systems throughout the United States.

Roseville is currently among only 4 total agencies in the class 2 division, competing for this prestigious award.

Jeff explained the details of the lengthy application process, including the submission of a short video highlighting Roseville Parks, Recreation and Libraries department.

This is Roseville's 4th year in a row to be a finalist for the award. Roseville last won the Gold Medal in 1972. This year's winner will be announced at the NRPA conference in September in Orlando.

No public comment received.

6.2. Fifty And Better (FAB) Program Update – Kiersten Killmer

Recreation Coordinator, Kiersten Killmer, gave a spotlight presentation on PRL's FAB program. A recreational activities club for our 50 plus community. The club currently has nearly 400 active FAB members.

Kiersten highlighted the many upcoming FAB activities and offerings, both new and ongoing, including trips and appreciation events. Programs are offered at both the Mahany Fitness Center and the Maidu Community Center.

Club offerings also include discussion groups, support groups and educational presentations.

Kiersten concluded her presentation by highlighting the success of one particular event, Puzzle Palooza Series, which has become quite popular. Since the age requirement is 14 and up, this promotes some intergenerational involvement. So far there have been two sessions, each with 25 teams competing to see who can put together a 400 piece puzzle the fastest. The next competition will be October 10th at the Mahany Fitness Center.

Public Comment

Resident Jennifer shared about the Parkinson's support group meetings that are listed in the FAB newsletter and asked if attendees have to be a member of FAB to attend.

Kiersten answered that, no, all of the support group offerings are open to all seniors, they do not need to join FAB to attend, but do need to sign a participation waiver with facility staff.

7. STAFF / COMMISSIONER REPORTS

7.1. Staff Report - Jeff Nereson

Jeff Nereson informed the commission of the upcoming Placer PROTECT Senior Resource Fair which is Thursday 9/11/25 at the Maidu Community Center with approximately 60 resource vendors. Flyers with details of included workshops and presentations were distributed to the commission members.

Jeff informed that he would be reaching out to commission members to see who might be interested in scheduling time at the resource fair to work at our FAB resource booth. He also expressed that this would be a good way to promote the Senior Commission and gain insight into the needs of our senior community.

Jeff updated the commission about the PRL survey that was launched in late March and extended into July. We received over 2300 responses. Of those there were 721 responses specific to the 50 and over community. Jeff will continue to work on compiling the responses and bring the final results to the next commission meeting.

Commissioner Wagner shared that included at the Senior Resource Fair would be free flu shots.

Chairperson Soto asked about the flyer and where they are being distributed. Jeff answered that the flyer was taken directly from the Placer PROTECT website and although we know they promote through social media, we don't have any information of how or where they are distributing the flyers. For the City, we will promote within our facilities, but won't promote or market elsewhere with flyers, as this event is hosted by Placer County.

Commissioner Lee asked if we would have flyers promoting the Senior Commission to hand out at the FAB booth. Jeff said we would, and would also look into what was used last year. He also encouraged that if any commission members have any ideas to help with promotion, to contact him.

Some discussion was had among commissioners about different ideas for what items could be used to provide information to fair attendees regarding senior community needs and the commission.

Public Comment

Resident Jennifer suggested that there be some acknowledgement of “9/11” at the Placer PROTECT event, since it is on the date of 9/11/25.

8. ADJOURNMENT
