### 1. CALL TO ORDER

#### 5.1. Meeting Minutes- August 13, 2025

## **6. REQUESTS/PRESENTATIONS**

### **6.1. Alzheimer's Association Programs and Services – Alexandra Weisgerber**

Alzheimer's Association representative, Alexandra Weisgerber shared information about all that the non-profit organization offers including the many resources available. Brochures and flyers were handed out.

Some highlights to the presentation were:

- Facts and Figures, for instance 7 million Americans affected
- Types of the disease, Dementia is an umbrella term for many different conditions including Alzheimer's
- 10 Warning signs, including daily disruptive memory loss and withdrawal from work or social events
- And healthy behaviors for the brain.

Alexandria explained how to access the organization's resources like an online community and 24/7 helpline. All services and referral for services are free.

Commissioner Cheng asked how long does it usually take to get a consultation or physical help. Alexandra answered that the 24/7 help line is staffed with knowledgeable representatives that can get callers in touch with service providers right away.

Commissioner Soto asked where funding comes from for these services. Alexandra answered that much of it comes from fundraisers, campaigns, some grants and private donors.

Commissioner Janisch asked how the Respite Funding service works. Alexandra explained that use of this service starts with an application process and once approved the Alzheimer's Association connects the client with a care consultant. The caregiver resource then would bill Alzheimer's to pay for the services via grant funding up to \$1000 each.

No public comment received.

### **6.2. Parks, Recreation & Libraries Customer Survey Results – Jeff Nereson**

Parks, Recreation & Libraries Manager, Jeff Nereson, reported on the survey results from the City's most recent annual customer survey from the period of April – July 2025.

The survey was specific to Parks, Recreation & Libraries (PRL) offerings and was sent out via email, Facebook and other social media to 64,000 residents. Approximately 2,300 total responses were received and of those 721 or 30% were from respondents aged 50+.

Jeff shared some of the questions asked in the survey and the results to them, such as:

- Are you satisfied with PRL programs and services? 85% of 50+ respondents answered Satisfied / Very Satisfied
- Do you use parks, trails or open spaces within Roseville? 85% of 50+ respondents answered Yes and 90% answered that they feel safe while using our outdoor spaces.
- 76% of respondents 50+ use our Libraries.

Jeff then shared how PRL will be using these survey results to improve on the areas of lower percentage of satisfaction and meeting more of the needs of our adult communities. Such as adding suggested program offerings like cooking, dance and music classes.

Jeff then answered a few questions from the commission about specific PRL offerings and volunteer opportunities.

#### Public Comment

One member of the public asked about why the City of Roseville's PRL department promotes the Maidu Museum and Historical Site but not the Carnegie Museum in Roseville. Jeff explained that although the City does own the building that Carnegie is in, it is operated by an external organization, the Roseville Historical Society.

## **7. STAFF / COMMISSIONER REPORTS**

### **7.1. Staff Report - Jeff Nereson**

Jeff Nereson informed the commission of the positive feedback received about the Placer PROTECT Senior Resource Fair held back in September 2025 at the Maidu Community Center with approximately 60 resource vendors. Many visitors were pleased with all that was included such as workshops and presentations.

Commissioner Cheng asked about the FAB Club and if more activities will be offered at the Mahany Fitness Center location, much like the

amount of offerings at Maidu Community Center. And if transportation would eventually be available for participants between facilities.

PRL Recreation Coordinator, Kiersten Killmer, who was in attendance and is the FAB Club coordinator, answered that because Maidu has an entire activity wing and multiple spaces available for FAB programming, there are more offerings there. Where as at Mahany, the building only has one activity room, but it is available to FAB every week day. As for transportation between facilities, it could not be provided by the City, but there are ride services available such as Placer Rides.

Kiersten then gave a brief update on upcoming FAB events such as a day trip, crafting class, watercolor class and Puzzle Palooza.

No public comment received.
