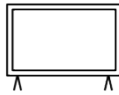



I. CALL TO ORDER

V. PRESENTATIONS/REPORTS

1. Minutes (PARKS, RECREATION, AND LIBRARIES DEPARTMENT - LIBRARY)

Summary: Approval of January 26, 2026, Minutes.

Motion made by Fisk to approve the January 26, 2026, Library Board Meeting minutes.
Seconded by Fullmer. All in favor, none opposed. Motion passed.

2. Welcome New Library Board Member (PARKS, RECREATION, AND LIBRARIES DEPARTMENT - LIBRARY)

New Library Board youth member Rochaelin Nguyen was introduced. Nguyen is a Junior at Westpark High School in Roseville.

3. Election of Library Board Chair and Vice Chair (PARKS, RECREATION, AND LIBRARIES DEPARTMENT - LIBRARY)

Motion made by Speaker to elect Parella as Library Board Chair. Seconded by Fisk. All in favor, none opposed. Motion passed.

Motion made by Fullmer to elect Speaker as Library Board Vice Chair. Seconded by Parella. All in favor, none opposed. Motion passed.

4. Cultural Arts- Review and Updates (PARKS, RECREATION, AND LIBRARIES DEPARTMENT - LIBRARY)

Cultural Arts Supervisor Annie Stanco presented key initiatives, partnerships, and milestones from the past two years, highlighting program growth and community engagement in the City's Cultural Arts initiatives. Murals and art installations have been completed at the Art Center at Royer Park, Weber Park, Johnson Pool, and the Placer Valley Soccer Complex. Successful events included Letters to the Sky: Conversations of the Heart and Inspire in partnership with Blue Line Arts. Other partnerships have been created with Lyric Beat Leaders, artist Matthew Trammel, Latino Leadership Council, Union Pacific, Placer Conservancy, Friends of the Library, Environmental Utilities and the Arts Council of Placer County. The upcoming United by Art Series will consist of three events: Chalk & Art Festival on July 18th, Community Canvas on August 22nd and Through my Eyes on September 26th. Upcoming additional art installations are planned at the Downtown Library and the Art Center at Royer Park.

5. Library Outreach and Marketing Initiatives (PARKS, RECREATION, AND LIBRARIES DEPARTMENT - LIBRARY)

Library Supervisor Cambria Evans and Librarian Emma Foster shared highlights of the Library's outreach and marketing initiatives. The marketing approach of the library utilizes in-house advertising with TV ads at department locations, word of mouth, flyers and placards in addition to external advertising on social media platforms, city websites, PRL magazine, FAB newsletter, external partner and local websites and school packets. This marketing approach prioritizes high-impact channels based on reach, access, staff time and focuses on high-visibility platforms. In 2025 over 145 marketing requests were submitted. The philosophy of the library outreach for the Roseville Public Library is to introduce or renew community members' sense of inclusion for the programs and services Roseville Public Library provides. From January-March 2026, outreach efforts have connected with 1,137 community members. Library outreach events have included school tours with the UEC and Adventure Club, school literacy and family reading nights, senior homes, PRL FloatingEgg-Stravaganza, PCOE Family Math Night, Lunch at the Library and Placer

County Fair. Statewide initiative Every Story Counts was held from January 26-31, 2026 and 200 responses were received. All responses praised the programs and services of the Roseville Public Library. Goals for 2026 include assessing community needs, telling our story more broadly and to continue refining efficiencies of library outreach and marketing. When people connect with their library, the whole community grows stronger.

6. Library Collection Materials Update (PARKS, RECREATION, AND LIBRARIES DEPARTMENT - LIBRARY)

Library Supervisor Jessica Huff and Librarian Margaret Thordsen provided updates on the Library collections and materials. The Collection Development policy of the Roseville Public Library is in compliance with the California Freedom to Read Act (AB1825) which required every public library jurisdiction that receives state funding to have a publicly accessible Collection Development Policy by January 1, 2026. This Act protects the right of the public to access library materials and protects library staff, whose actions are in accordance with the CD policy, from censure. Picture Books and Graphic Novels for Children have seen an increase in circulation over last year. Usage of digital materials is increasing, but physical materials remain the heart of the collection. The library responds to the community by looking at circulation statistics to determine how funds and space is allocated as well as managing holds ratios. Community requests are managed through purchase suggestions and InterLibrary Loans (ILLs). The library responds to community feedback through requests for reconsideration, reference requests and referrals and general trends.

7. Libraries & Culture Report (PARKS, RECREATION, AND LIBRARIES DEPARTMENT - LIBRARY)

City Librarian Narinder Sufi provided updates on the Libraries & Culture Division operations, including libraries, Maidu Museum & Historic Site, and Cultural Arts initiatives. April is National Volunteer Month and the library gives a big thank you to each volunteer for being a local hero. Our Friends of the Library volunteer organization helps fund all library programs. April 20-25 is National Library Week. The Parks Recreation & Libraries Department has applied for the National Gold Medal Award again. The American Revolution Experience presented by American Battlefield Trust will be on display at the Downtown Library from April 2-9, 2026. The Maidu Museum & Historic Site will have a new exhibition entitled Fields of You showing until July 2026.
